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Parents and families play an important role in how well children do in school and in the community. They are the first agents at identifying children's strengths and concerns, opening doors to support and services, and ensuring that those doors remain open to meet their children and family needs. This training will help participants (1) understand what effective family and parental advocacy means and its benefits, (2) learn strategies on how to effectively work with school staff and service providers to meet your child's support needs, (3), recognize ways to build and sustain home, school and community partnerships and collaboration, and (4) learn about available resources in the community.
