Increase in Autism Prevalence

New Report from the Centers for Disease Control

On March 24, 2023, the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) released the most recent estimate of the prevalence of autism spectrum disorder (ASD) in the United States (Maenner and colleagues, 2023). Eleven study sites across the United States conducted record reviews of 8-year-olds in 2020 to determine whether children had an autism diagnosis provided by a community medical or education professional.

Across all 11 sites that formed the Autism and Developmental Disabilities Monitoring (ADDM) Network, one in 36 8-year-olds had an autism diagnosis. Autism was 3.8 times more prevalent among boys (approximately 4% of boys) than among girls (approximately 1% of girls). These estimates are higher than previous ADDM Network estimates during 2000–2018. For the first time among children aged 8 years, the prevalence of ASD was lower among White children than among other racial and ethnic groups, reversing the direction of racial and ethnic differences in ASD prevalence observed in the past.

A major clinical implication of the CDC's prevalence findings is for parents to seek autism screening for their child. This is particularly important for younger siblings of a child with autism. Screening should continue beyond the preschool years. Tell your pediatrician if you think that your child is showing signs of autism.

First STEPS: Researchers are studying whether there is a difference between effectiveness of inperson and virtually delivered social communication interventions for toddlers with autism.
