Clinical Programs Strengthened by Collaboration

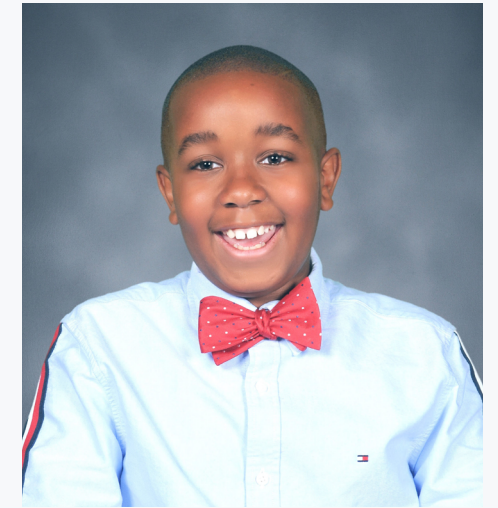
- **RUBI:** Coaching caregivers to guide preschoolers’ growth and behavior.
