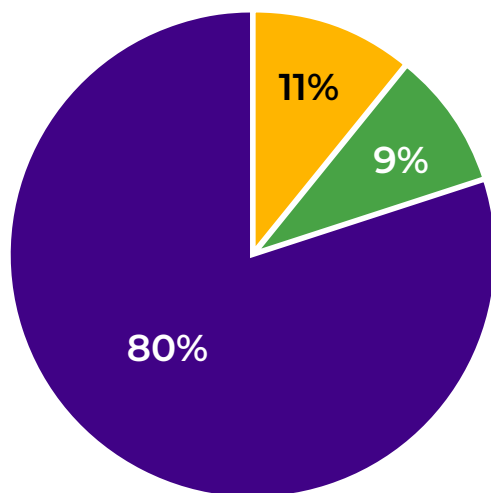
Who We Are

The Community Rehabilitation Program at Kennedy Krieger Institute provides short-term, interdisciplinary rehabilitation services in the home and community for infants, children and young adults following hospitalization or significant medical events. Our experienced team delivers individualized therapy in the patient's natural environment, helping them build functional skills while supporting families throughout recovery. Many of the patients we serve have complex medical needs, including patients who are medically fragile.

Who We Serve

We serve infants, children and young adults who:

- Are medically fragile
- Have neurological, developmental, orthopedic and/or complex medical conditions
- Have feeding and/or swallowing disorders and may benefit from feeding therapy
- Are recovering from hospitalization, surgery or serious illness
- Require rehabilitation to safely transition from the hospital to home and community



- Neurorehabilitation
- Postorthopedic Surgery
- Focused Interdisciplinary Rehabilitation

Our patients range in age from infants to age 60.



Our Team

Our interdisciplinary team includes:

- Clinical social worker/case manager
- Occupational therapists
- Physical therapists
- Speech-language pathologists (including certified bilingual clinicians)

Additional consultative services are provided, as needed.

Our Treatment Approach

Each patient receives a comprehensive evaluation to identify their unique strengths and needs. Based on these findings, our interdisciplinary team develops an individualized plan of care focused on maximizing functioning, promoting independence, and achieving meaningful goals. Therapy emphasizes caregiver education, skill development, and coordination with medical providers and community resources to support long-term success and, when appropriate, a seamless transition to ongoing services.



Our Success

Our program has a proven record of treatment success and patient satisfaction:

- 96% of our patients have met or exceeded goals set in areas such as self-care, mobility, cognition and levels of independence
- 100% of our patients have returned to community programs
- 100% of caregiver surveys indicate overall satisfaction
- 100% of caregivers report learning from their child's therapist about how to help their child at home

Cost Benefits

Our program offers a variety of benefits for a decreased cost of care, including:

- Earlier discharge from the hospital setting
- Shorter time needed for services
