

Pediatric Physical Therapy Residency Program Frequently Asked Questions

1. How many hours will I work a week?

The resident will be scheduled to work approximately 45 hours/week between clinical patient care, didactics, and evidence-based projects. However, the exact number of hours per week will vary depending on the needs of each clinical site and didactic requirements that week. There will also be additional time required outside of regular working hours for you to complete assignments, watch online lectures, and prepare for teaching presentations.

2. Do I have to pay for any courses?

The resident will not have to pay for any lectures that are designated requirements of the residency program. The resident will receive a stipend to cover some of the cost for CEU courses or APTA conferences during the year.

3. Will I have access to a library?

The resident will have free access to Welch Medical Library at Johns Hopkins. The collection covers health, the practice of medicine and related biomedical and allied health care disciplines, public health and related disciplines, nursing, research literature, methodological literature, reviews or state-of-the-art reports, and in-depth, authoritative analyses of areas influencing biomedicine and healthcare. The library's emphasis is on providing materials at point of need. As a result, the collection includes more than 5000 electronic journals, more than 400 databases, and more than 2000 electronic books.

4. What is the salary for the program? \$48,000/year?.

5. Will I have any special privileges at Johns Hopkins Hospital?

The resident will be granted a JHH Appointment, which will enable access to additional (optional) courses offered by the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine.

6. Will I have medical benefits?

The resident will be a full time trainee of Kennedy Krieger Institute and will have medical and liability coverage. Medical coverage has a monthly payroll deduction, the amount of which is based on the plan chosen.

7. Is housing provided? Housing is not provided and residents are responsible for finding their own housing while in Baltimore. We can provide a list of housing options in the area.
